"I was on orders in Virginia with another veteran waiting for our separations," said Marquita, a Navy veteran.

"Wounded Warrior Project helps me cope and understand that I am not alone when it comes to post-traumatic

stress," she said.

and mentor other veterans.

"I feel grateful and thankful for Wounded Warrior Project," Marquita said. "I'm able to celebrate and enjoy life
