Wounded Warrior Project Set Annual Record More than \$71 Million to Injured Veterans in 2016

relief as Wounded Warrior Project[®] (WWP) sets an unprecedented record, securing more than\$71 million in annualized

monetary benefits for wounded service members in fiscal year 2016 – an annual high for the organization – with more than six

weeks remaining in the year. With long-term financial and medical support playing a critical empowerment role in the recovery

process, WWP created the Benefits Service program, helping injured veterans navigate the complexities of the Department of

The success of the WWP Benefits Service program lies in its efforts to ensure claims are filed and processed correctly – the first

time.

better understanding injured veterans' unique needs. They are experts in the veteran claims process, advising warriors of

benefit options, filing benefit claims, and helping to obtain necessary evidence," said Mike Linnington, WWP chief executive

officer. "The staff stays connected with these heroes through the entire claim lifecycle."
