Vail Resorts Supports Veteran Healing Through Wounded Warrior Project

Last year, Vail Resorts announced plans to support WWP in the form of a \$1 donation for every season pass sold during the 2018-2019 season in celebration of the 10th anniversary of the Epic Pass. The company surpassed the original target of \$750,000 by donating more than \$900,000.

The two organizations partnered on warrior events this winter season. [By bringing warriors together](#) through ski and snowboard events at Vail Resorts locations and other ski resorts, WWP is able to create new connections and help identify the support network needed to overcome challenges warriors may face. In a WWP survey (<https://www.woundedwarriorproject.org/survey>) of the wounded warriors it serves, more than half of survey respondents (52.6 percent) expressed they talk with fellow veterans to address their mental health concerns.

Warriors never pay a penny for WWP programs – they paid their dues on the battlefield. WWP's free services in mental health, career counseling, and long-term rehabilitative care change lives.
